'GRANADA' BRACELET

Skill Level: Intermediate

Techniques to know: peyote stitch, herringbone, picot, fringe, familiar with two-holed beads, ending and adding thread.

Finished size: 6 5/8"x 1 1/4" (17x3 cm)

MATERIALS

1 gram size 15° seed beads 2 grams size 11° seed beads 2 grams size 8° seed beads 1 gram size 6° seed beads 16 x 4mm fire polished rounds 8 x 8mm fire polished rounds 32 x GemDuos
2 x 5mm open jump rings
1 x 16mm toggle clasp
6lb. Fireline or D weight beading thread
Size 12 beading needle
Scissors

DESIGNER NOTE

Check all holes of GemDuo beads to make sure they are clear before stitching.

Step 1

Component A. Use a yard of thread to string four 11°s. Sew back through all beads again to form a tight circle, leaving a 3" tail. Tie a square knot between the tail and the working thread, continue weaving through beads to hide the knot and exit from an 11°. Trim the tail.

Step 2

String an 11° and sew through next 11° (red thread). Repeat this stitch three more times. Retrace previous thread path and exit from the first 11° added in this round (**black thread**).

Step 3

String two 11°s and sew through the next 11° of previous round (red thread). Repeat this stitch three more times. Retrace previous thread path and exit from the first 11° added in this round (**black thread**).

Step 4

String an 11° and sew through the next 11° (red thread). String an 8° and sew through next 11° (blue thread). Repeat these stitches three more times. Retrace previous thread path and exit form the first 11° added in this round (black thread).

Step 5

String an 8° and sew through the next 8° (red thread). String an 8° and sew through the next 11° (blue thread). Repeat these stitches three more times. Retrace previous thread path and exit form the first 8° added in this round (black thread).

Step 6

String two GemDuos. Sew through the next 8° (**red thread**). String an 8° and sew through the next 8° (**blue thread**). Repeat these stitches three more times. Retrace previous thread path and step up through the top hole of the first GemDuo added in this round (**black thread**).

Step 7

String an 11°, a 4mm fire polish, an 11° and sew through the top hole of the next GemDuo (red thread). String three 15°s and sew through the next 8° (blue thread). String three 15°s and sew through the top hole of the next GemDuo (fuchsia thread). Repeat these stitches three more times and exit from the first 11° added in this round (black thread).

Step 8

[a] String two 11°s, a 15°, an 8°, a 15°, two 11°s and sew through following beads: an 11°, a GemDuo and two 15°s (red thread). String a 6° and sew though following two 15°s, a GemDuo and 11° (black thread).
[b] Repeat these stitches three more times. Retrace previous thread path to exit from the second 6° added in this round, at the left edge of the Component.

Step 9

Bail. [a] String two 11°s, an 8mm fire polish, a 6° and sew back through the same fire polish (red thread). String two 11°s and sew through the 6° exited (**black thread**). [b] String an 11° and sew through next two 11°s, fire polish, 6°. Sew back through the fire polish and the next two 11°s (red thread). String an 11° and retrace previous thread path through the bail (not shown for clarity). Weave through several beads, secure the thread and trim it.

Step 10

Form Components B and C repeating Steps from 1 to 8, on the last repeat, exit from the top left 8°. Form Component D following Steps from 1 to 9; then proceed through beads to exit from top left 8°. Lay the four components on your work surface with bails at either ends.


Step 11

Assembly. Lay Component A and Component B side by side. Thread is exiting from an 8° at top left of Component B. **[1]** String two 11°s, an 8mm fire polish, two 11°s and sew from the bottom to top through the mirror 8° of Component A (**red thread**). String three 11°s and sew back through the fire polish. String three 11°s and sew back through the 8° exited of Component B. Repeat the thread path to reinforce (not shown for clarity). Continue weaving through beads of Component B to exit from the bottom left 8° (**black thread**). **[2]** String three 11°s, an 8mm fire polish, three 11°s and sew through the mirror 8° of Component A (**red thread**). String three 11°s and sew through the mirror 8° of Component A (**red thread**). **[2]** String three 11°s, an 8mm fire polish, three 11°s and sew through the mirror 8° of Component A (**red thread**). String two 11°s and sew back through the fire polish. String two 11° and sew back through the 8° exited of Component B. Repeat the thread path to reinforce (not shown for clarity). 
Step 12


Repeat the assembly between Components B-C and C-D. Use an open jump ring to attach half of the clasp to a 6° end. Repeat on the other end of the bracelet.
