

Snowman Earrings

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Supply List

- 2 Glass Pearls or round beads, 6mm
- 2 Glass Pearls or round beads, 8mm
- 2 Rhinestone Rondelles, 5 or 6mm for scarf (red)
- 2 Rhinestone Squaredelles, 5 or 6mm for hat brim
 - Can substitute a sequin instead, or other flat black disc bead
- 2 Brilliance Austrian Crystal Cube Beads, 4mm (5601)
- 2 Headpins, 2 or 3 inches long
- 2 Ear Wires



Tools needed

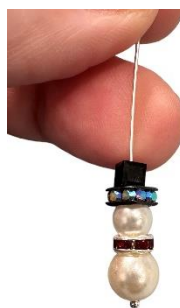
- Round nose pliers
- Flat nose pliers
- Wire cutters
- One Step Loopers (optional in place of round nose pliers)

These festive earrings are a holiday classic! When I saw them, I knew I needed to gather all the components into kits – they're just too fun! They are super easy to make – just a single basic wire loop or wrapped loop. I'll walk you through it...

Load the Beads

On your headpin, load:

- One 8mm pearl
- Rhinestone Rondelle for scarf
- One 6mm pearl
- Squaredelle for hat brim
- Cube crystal for hat



Create the Loop on Top

You can either use a basic wire loop at the top, or a wrapped wire loop. Whichever is your preference.

Basic Wire Loop Option

Make a basic wire loop at the top, either using One Step Loopers, or your round and flat nose pliers.

Wrapped Wire Loop Option

Attach the Earring Finding

Using your flat or needle nose pliers, open the loop on your ear wire, and insert the Snowman loop. Then close the ear wire loop.

Repeat for a second earring, and enjoy all the attention you get while wearing them!!
